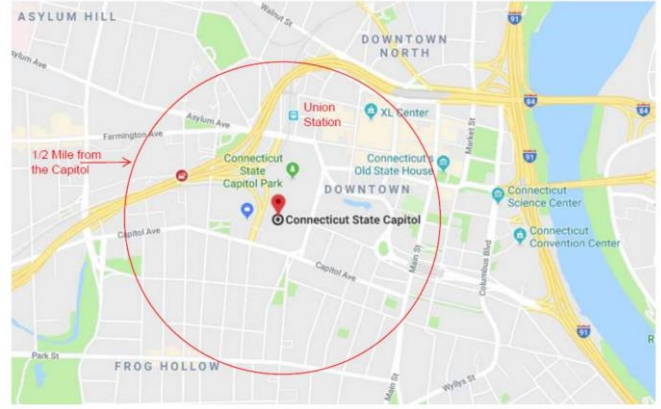

## Directions to Legislative Office Building (Hartford)



The Legislative Office Building is located at 300 Capitol Avenue, Hartford, next to the State Capitol.

### Traveling on I-84 East

- Take Exit 48, Capitol Avenue, get into the right lane of the exit ramp.
- At the end of the exit ramp turn right onto Capitol Avenue.
- Take the first right past the Legislative Office Building, proceed to the back of the garage and take a right to enter the garage using the left hand lane (employees) or the right hand lane (visitors).

### Traveling on I-84 West

- Take Exit 48, Asylum Street, at the end of the exit ramp turn right at the light onto Asylum Street.
- At the YWCA turn left onto Broad Street, proceed through two stop lights, immediately after the Armory building take the first left and then another left at the end of the short access road.
- Follow this road around the garage to the back and take a right to enter the garage.

### Traveling on I-91 North or South

- Take Exit 29A, Capitol Avenue, proceed through the Pulaski Circle at the end of the long exit road.
- Take a right on Elm Street and turn left at Trinity Street.
- Go past the Capitol building and the I-84 entrance ramp, all on your right.
- Take the first right past the Legislative Office Building, proceed to the back of the garage and take a right to enter the garage using the left hand lane (employees) or the right hand lane (visitors).

## Parking and Transit

Limited public parking is available on the first floor of the parking garage adjacent to the Legislative Office Building. Exit the first floor of the parking garage and proceed to the west entrance (facing Broad Street) to the Legislative Office Building.

The Legislative Office Building is a 10-15 minute walk from the Hartford train and bus station.

**BUS TRANSIT:** CT Transit provides local bus service throughout Hartford. Several bus stops are within a short walk to the Capitol and Legislative Office Building. Go to: [www.cttransit.com](http://www.cttransit.com) for more information on bus routes and stops.

**COMMUTER RAIL:** CT Rail's Hartford Line provides 17 trains a day between New Haven and Hartford (Union Station) with stops in Wallingford, Meriden and Berlin. 12 of those trains continuing to Springfield stopping in Windsor and Windsor Locks.
